

Second evening of BOV Streets Alive more colourful than ever

Children too found their entertainment space at the kids' corner in Republic street with the participation of stilt walkers and fun animators.

A sculpture garden by Sue and David Mifsud inside the Auberge D'italie complimented a host of artists from the Society of Manufactures and Arts in Merchant Street. There was also live entertainment from the Malta Dance Sport Association who hosted a spectacular and colourful ballroom dancing session at the Casino Maltese.

The highlight of the evening was a programme of Neapolitan songs and extracts from operettas in Great Siege Square by Vox Lyrica made up of tenor George Saliba and sopranos Marita Bezzina and Rosabelle Pavia.
