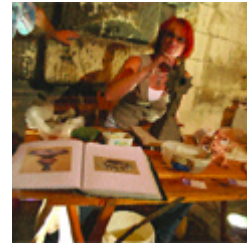


BOV Valletta Streets Alive comes to an end
