

Updated: Changes to the current Valletta Piano project

The façade of a block of flats on the left side of the entrance to Valletta gate might be renovated, the area in front which will no longer be used as a bus terminus might also be included in this project, but the idea of turning the old theatre into an open one was still on, the Prime Minister Lawrence Gonzi said.

He made these proposals during a meeting with the architect Renzo Piano on the Valletta project. Dr Gonzi explained that as the shops near St James Cavalier will be pulled down, the beautiful façade of St James will be fully exposed. Thus the current look of these flats will not fit in with the style of the rest of the city.

Dr Gonzi said that during the meeting he informed Mr Piano about the public transport reform and proposed that better use should be made out of the City Gate, as buses will no longer gather in this zone.

Even though many people, including tenor Joseph Calleja had criticised the concept of an open theatre, Dr Gonzi said if this theatre was to be rebuilt, it would be too small, while a roofless one would give an added value to the country.

Dr Gonzi said since the public consultation, a lot of technical work had been carried out and the first works, that is hoarding and covering the zones with nets, are expected to start next April. Another meeting with Mr Piano is expected to be held in June.

The project so far seems to be proceeding within budget and on time. However the new proposed additions would have to be budgeted separately, and it was too early to give an estimate of the total sum, he stated. These proposals will only be carried out if the country is in a position to afford them, Dr Gonzi stated.

The Prime Minister added that during the meeting the use of geothermic energy and photovoltaic panels for the new parliament building were also discussed.

He said that Piano like many artists appreciates the beauty of the Maltese stone which will dominate the whole project. Following various experiments, it resulted that it was possible even where the use large slabs of stone was necessary.

The whole project will be signed by Mr Piano, but will have a Maltese DNA, Dr Gonzi concluded.
